Garment	Colour	Additional Information
Jumper/Cardigan	Royal Blue	With school crest.
Academy Tie	Navy Blue	With school crest and appropriate house colours.
The above items must be bought from TOTAL CLOTHING.		
Shirt/Blouse	White	Formal and plain (short or long sleeve acceptable).
Trousers	Navy Blue	Must be a traditional formal 'suit' style trouser and must be full length (non-jeans style). No casual or 'skinny-type' trousers acceptable.
Skirt	Navy Blue	<p>Choice between:</p> <div style="display: flex; align-items: center;">  <div style="margin-left: 10px;"> <p>Charleston Pleated Skirt. This skirt has a back zip, deep yolk and all round knife pleats. Available in various lengths, please choose the skirt length that fits to the knee. Skirts do not have the school logo. This skirt is available from our chosen school uniform provider Total Clothing, you can also purchase similar pleated skirts from other retailers.</p> <p>Luton Straight Skirt. This skirt has a back vent with two front pockets and zip or button fastening. Available in various lengths, please choose the length that fits to the knee. Skirts do not have the school logo. This skirt is available from our chosen school uniform provider Total Clothing, you can also purchase similar straight skirts from other retailers.</p> <p>Please note skirts from “stretchy” fabric are not suitable school uniform.</p> </div> </div>

Tights	Black, navy or neutral	Plain, no patterns.
Socks	Black, navy or white	
Footwear	Plain, dark colour	Traditional/formal style in leather or leather-style – heels must not exceed 6 cm. No trainers/canvas style shoes will be acceptable. Shoes manufactured by trainer companies, with logos or badges will be viewed as trainers.
Coats	Plain, dark colour	<p>Coats must be plain and dark, preferably black or navy.</p> <p>Coats can be worn outside but must not be worn anywhere inside the school buildings. This rule also applies to any additional external wear ie scarves, gloves etc.</p> <p>Hoodies and tracksuit style tops are not acceptable and must not be worn in school at any time.</p>
Hair	Natural colour only	No extreme styles – at the discretion of Senior Team.

Jewellery		One pair of small stud earrings are allowed (to be worn one in each ear or a single earring). A single discreet necklace, bracelet and ring are allowed. Nose studs/rings and other body piercings are not allowed. We advise that no jewellery of value is worn.
Make-up		Must be 'discreet'. Nail varnish/polish must be a neutral colour and nails must be rounded not of a 'talon' style – at the discretion of the Senior Team.

- Non marking training shoes for all – no fashion shoes allowed, just supportive trainers
- Astro boots strongly recommended
- Mouth guard must be worn for Hockey and Rugby

BODY PIERCING STATEMENT

It is the Academy policy that students are smartly dressed in a 'uniform' fashion. We ask students not to make fashion statements about themselves, either in their clothing or in their jewellery.

Therefore, we stipulate that only one pair of small, plain ear studs (worn one in each ear or a single earring) and one plain, discreet bracelet and necklace may be worn.

We have a responsibility for the health and safety of students while we are 'in loco parentis' during school hours. Other body piercings decorated with studs/rings can constitute a potential danger to students, especially in practical lessons – like PE, Technology, Drama and Science – and in the hustle and bustle of moving around the Academy. For this reason, we do not allow other body pierced jewellery.

If a student wishes to have body pierced jewellery other than that allowed by the College, we stipulate that they have the piercing done at the beginning of the long summer holiday. This gives several weeks for the piercing to establish itself. The student is then able to take out the stud/ring safely to attend school but to replace it at home.

Any student wearing a ring or stud other than those allowed in the uniform code, who will not remove it on request, will be thought of as being uncooperative with the rules of the College. Lack of cooperation is punishable by exclusion.

GENERAL

Please note This is general information. As you know "fashion trends" come and go so our list cannot be exhaustive. It is at the Headteachers discretion to take action regarding any fashion trend or hairstyle which we feel is unacceptable.

PERSONAL PROPERTY

The Academy accepts no responsibility for any personal property brought onto the site. All students should be discouraged from bringing valuable items into the Academy. If this is unavoidable, special arrangements should be made in advance for temporary safe keeping.

Students will be provided with lockers for storage of personal property.

Should personal property, including valuables such as mobile phones, go missing whilst on Academy premises, even whilst in a student locker, the Academy accepts no responsibility.
